## Schedule of Regional Eucharistic Processions on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) June 22, 2025

The procession on Corpus Christi is an act of thanksgiving. It is an expression of our faith in Christ's presence in the Eucharist, that he dwells with us and that he leads us. The presence of our parishes and organizations demonstrates that, as St. Augustine said, we become what we receive.

The regional processions will take place according to the following schedules:

- St. Peter Cathedral, Erie: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The Procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:00 pm and will conclude at the Cathedral with Benediction.
- Holy Spirit Parish, Dubois: At St. Catherine Church, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 1:00 pm and will conclude at St. Catherine Church with Benediction.
- Epiphany of the Lord, Meadville: The procession will begin at St. Agatha Church following the 11:30 AM Mass, with a period of Eucharistic Adoration.
  From there, the procession will move to St. Brigid Church for a time of prayer, and then continue to St. Mary Church, where Adoration will resume and conclude with Benediction at 8:15 pm.
- St. Joseph, Sharon: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The procession will form at 2:00 pm at St. Joseph Church.
- St. Mary, St. Marys: The 180<sup>th</sup> Annual Corpus Christi Procession, a cherished tradition, begins at St Mary Church at and concluding at Sacred Heart Church. In the event of inclement weather, all will take place inside St. Mary's Church.
