

**Schedule of Regional Eucharistic Processions  
on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ  
(Corpus Christi)  
June 2, 2024**

The procession on Corpus Christi is an act of thanksgiving. It is an expression of our faith in Christ's presence in the Eucharist, that he dwells with us and that he leads us. The presence of our parishes and organizations demonstrates that, as St. Augustine said, we become what we receive.

The regional processions will take place according to the following schedules:

- St. Peter Cathedral, Erie: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:00 pm.
- Holy Spirit Parish, DuBois: At St. Catherine Church, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 1:00 pm.
- St. Callistus, Kane: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at 1:00 pm. The procession will form at 2:00 pm. Benediction will be held at the conclusion of the procession.
- The Epiphany of the Lord, Meadville: The procession will start at St. Mary Church at 12:45 pm with adoration. It will proceed to St. Brigid Church for another prayer interlude, then continue to St. Agatha Church for reposition and a social afterward.
- Saint Joseph, Sharon: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of the 11:00 am Mass. The procession will form at 2:00 pm. Once the procession has returned to the church, Deacon Michael Scanga will preach on the Eucharist. The celebration will conclude with benediction.
- St. Mary, St. Marys: The 179<sup>th</sup> Annual Corpus Christi Procession, a cherished tradition, is Sunday, June 2, 2024, at 2:00 PM beginning at St. Mary Church and concluding at Sacred Heart Church. In the event of inclement weather, all will take place inside the St. Mary Church.
